Stinger Monument Brings Gunship Home

AC-119 Gunship Association president, retired Chief Master Sergeant Craig Corbett, and a host of air and ground crew members joined more than 100 family, friends, and other attendees in dedicating the AC-119K Stinger Gunship monument located in Hurlburt Field's Commando Air Park, in Ft Walton Beach, FL. The dedication took place during the Association's Sixth Annual Reunion on October 2, 2005. Keynote speaker was former 18th Special Operations Squadron (SOS) aircrew member, retired Chief Master Sergeant Bill Petrie of Oklahoma City.

The focus of the memorial project was to bring the gunship to a final resting place via a monument. The AC-119K Memorial features an 8gallant crews. Unfortunately, all of the AC-119s were either shot down, crashed, or scrapped after the evacuation of Vietnam, and for these varied reasons, no AC-119K gunship made it back to the United States after the Vietnam War. For many who involved with this illustrious gunship a part of them always remained missing. That fact prompted Chief Petrie to write a poem entitled *Our Lady of Night* which he read at the dedication. You can read the Poem on page 11.

In praising the maintenance and aircrews who kept the Stinger gunship flying and fighting Chief Petrie said "The memories of courage, commitment, and dedication of those we served with, coupled with the dedication of those who serve this association created this monument and enabled us to bring home our gunship.

foot high, three-foot wide, mirror finish, black granite stone capturing the Stinger gunship in combat over the Republic of Laos. The image of the gunship emerges from the black granite, much like it did in battle, like a ghost in the night with guns blazing amid antiaircraft fire. The front of the Memorial is engraved

with a brief history of the AC-119K gunship. The 18th Special Operations Squadron's logo is engraved below the text.

Former 18th SOS flight engineer, retired Senior Master Sergeant Gus Sininger, guided the memorial project to fruition. The AC-119 Gunship Association set aside \$10,000 to create a lasting monument to an aircraft that "never made it home."

The hunter/killer prowess of the AC-119K gunship over the famed Ho Chi Minh Trail, even while barraged by heavy anti-aircraft artillery, was evident in the hundreds of burned-out Soviet-built trucks littered across Indochina's landscape and the countless allied lives saved by the gunship and her Petrie added "May this memorial forever stand both as a tribute to the AC-119K air and ground crews who fought for freedom in Vietnam and as an enduring symbol of an aircraft that served us and the Air Force well. Finally, the courage and sacrifice of so many and the contributions of a proud old bird will forever stand tall in Hurlburt Field's Memorial Air Park."

Project officer, Gus Sininger, stated "The generosity and continued support from Association members, and family members of those we lost, have truly made this important day a reality," He added the AC-119K Gunship Association is still accepting donations to recoup costs associated with the monument's construction.

Annual Meeting Minutes

On Saturday, October 1, 2005, the Association meeting was called to order at 0805 hours by President **Craig Corbett** with the Invocation given by Association Chaplain **Larry Hunter**

Association Treasurer **Doug Wohlgamuth** presented his annual report. A nomination was presented and seconded, and the report approved as read.

Association Secretary **Jim Alvis** presented the annual report on membership statistics. A nomination was presented, seconded, and approved as read.

Ron Julian presented a report on the Master Contact List (MCL). Ron is seeking updated information about current and lost or deceased members.

President Corbett reported the 'Final Flight' of deceased association members since the last reunion.

Corbett also recognized the year-in and yearout hard work of six dedicated members. They are **Wayne Laessig**, **Bill Petrie**, **Everett Sprous**, **Doug Wohlgamuth**, **Gus Sininger**, and **Norm Evans**. The six were presented with special challenge coins at the Saturday evening banquet.

One member suggested a swap of coin numbers to match the member's LIFE membership number. This will be done among members.

A motion was presented to have the official AC-119 Gunship Association record changed to reflect that **Larry Fletcher** be recognized as a past president of the 2001-02 term. Larry filled in for the elected president during his absence and effectively led the organization during the entire term. A nomination was presented, seconded, and accepted.

Discussion ensued about changing the bylaws to recognize the *newsletter editor* and *webmaster* as non-voting board positions rather than voting positions. The Board, consisting of five elected positions, will be the only official voting members. This was also Approved.

President Corbett then offered a proposal that Larry Hunter be nominated to be the Association's designated Chaplain. The nomination was voted and accepted.

Corbett then proposed the establishment of coordinators for each squadron (3) plus all maintenance/support people (a total of four coordinators). The purpose of the coordinators is to assist in contacting and finding lost members and perspective members. That proposal was approved.

The establishment of a Quartermaster to oversee the purchase and sale of assoc. merchandise was proposed by President Corbett. This was approved.

Turner Publishing is offering to produce and sell a book about the AC-119 gunship program. Larry Fletcher is the coordinator on this project. This would be a hardcover book, about 129 pages. Much discussion ensued about the value of the publication. Several Gunship Association members who are/were Air Commando Association members stated they were quite disappointed in the final product of their book. A few members also supported the product. At this time, the Association will not pursue the book. Instead, we will attempt to collect before and after information for the 2006 reunion and then decide if we are to go forward. The requirements will be posted in the newsletter and on the website seeking member's input. This vote was tabled until next year.

Carryover elected positions for 2005-06 will be Treasurer Doug Wohlgamuth and Secretary Jim Alvis.

Wayne Laessig was nominated for President. Vern Hansen nominated for Vice President. Nominations were seconded and accepted for President and VP.

A nomination was made for current President Craig Corbett to fill the Past President position. The nomination was presented, seconded, and approved.

In other business, President Corbett proposed a bylaw change to reflect that members attending the annual association business meeting would vote for the reunion location two years forward instead of one. A nomination was presented, seconded, and approved to change the by-laws to make the reunion location be determined two years ahead instead of one. A hand-count indicated members would like to have a reunion in DC as well as out west. To move the reunion to other locations, a local reunion coordinator is absolutely necessary. The concern about having reunions at FWB for four more reunions is taxing on Gus and Norm.

Steve Mac Isaac volunteered to be the reunion coordinator for **Reunion VII at Albuquerque, NM**, home of the recently reactivated 71st SOS. The available dates are Sept. 29, 30, and Oct. 1, 2006. A nomination was made and seconded to hold Reunion VII at ABQ, and was unanimously approved.

Regarding Reunion 2007, a nomination was made to have Gus and Norm be the reunion coordinators, with assistance from other FWB members. The date would likely be Columbus Day weekend in October. This may be a combined reunion with the Spectre Association. The hotel location may also change.

Wayne Laessig noted we need Points of Contact (POC's) for each of the squadrons. Also, the association wants to continue the DVD project next year. Members are encouraged to buy the DVD set from Reunion V at Dayton, Ohio.

Steve Mac Isaac offered this message to all members – "be sure to check out the Awards and Decorations web page". Mac has seven cases pending to acquire awards. One case is nearing successful completion. Awards were made based on crew-awards rather than an individual basis. For any questions about awards and decorations, contact Steve at colmacmac@mac.com.

Anybody with mission tapes are asked to please forward them to Larry Fletcher. Larry will be the focal point to collect and document AC-119 historical items.

Everett Sprous is stepping down as newsletter editor, and Rogers Stevens will be his replacement. Everett has volunteered to be the Squadron Coordinator for the 18th SOS.

The 2005 annual business meeting was adjourned at 1043 hours by President Craig Corbett.
