

Special Guest at Reunion VII

A very special guest will epitomize the "Common Heritage" theme of this year's reunion. **Marvin Litke** is a C-47 pilot who was assigned to the 71st Troop Carrier Squadron (434th Troop Carrier Group) from its formation in 1943 to the conclusion of WW II. Not only did he fly C-47s, he also flew our own C-119s in the 1950s.

The 434th and its four troop carrier squadrons received little glory and honor for their efforts, but Patton's sweep across France to Germany would never have been successful had it not been for the troop carrier guys. If they were not towing CG-4 gliders or dropping paratroopers, they were flying re-supply missions and evacuating wounded allied troops.
