In their memory Andrea Drzyzga has crafted a four paned banner depicting the four aircraft we lost in flight and the two ground casualties we experienced. Additionally, five ales named and labeled for the call signs of our four lost aircraft and the call sign of a Spectre also lost during that conflict have been donated by Steve Sirois of Callsign Brewing. The ales are significant in that they symbolize the post flight beer all our crews enjoyed at maintenance debrief. They further symbolize the beer enjoyed by all in the squadron hooches and at the various off duty activities where we interacted, let off steam, and cemented friendships which transcend our lifetimes.
