A good while ago I ordered a USAF Vietnam Veteran ball cap but now, at Christmas time, I'm bombarded w/catalogs galore. Nothing new there. I took a closer look at the most recent and saw that the company carried a medal of which I'd never heard: the "USAF Combat Action Medal." "Awarded to Airmen to have directly participated in active combat, either in the air or on the ground, as part of their official duties" according to the catalog's writeup. The medallion depicts the USAF eagle within a wreath and the cloth above is a reddish color with diagonal yellow stripes. "Airmen" is defined on the USAF's decorations website as officer and enlisted. Wikipedia tells that it's the only USAF medal I've seen with diagonal stripes and one must apply via AF Form 3994 (the normal form for submitting for an award). Between Wikipedia and the USAF Awards website, I take it that the catalog's writeup is accurate. All that said, my guestions are:

A. How can a retired USAFer apply for this award so that it is given officially? And through whom?

B. Since the medal was only instituted in 2007, are we Vietnam guys even eligible?

C. I'd also wonder if the organization would be able to apply for the medal for everyone on our Alpha Roster somehow.
