

AEROSPACE MUSEUM of CALIFORNIA at the old MCCLELLAN AFB

The Aerospace Museum of California has on display a wide range of aircraft types, both military & civilian. These include fighters, trainers, transports, bi-planes, an extensive engine collection, & aerospace exhibits. The Aerospace Museum of California is open six days a week Tuesday through Saturday the museum is open to the public from 9:00am to 5:00pm. On Sundays, the museum is open to the public from 10:00am to 5:00pm.



The Fairchild C-119 was a larger & improved version of their C-82 'Packet' designed for paratroops & large cargo air-drop, with rear clam-shell doors & a monorail system for the delivery of items through doors in the floor of the cargo compartment. Initial versions were powered by Pratt-Whitney R-4360 engines, but later versions used R-3350 engines, & gross weight increased to 85,000 lbs. The most produced aircraft version was the C-119G. C-119s served principally with Troop Carrier Command & saw wartime service in Korea with the 314th Air Division. Several aircraft were modified in 1960 using 'snatch' techniques to recover space capsules during their descent from orbit. During the Vietnam War, some C-119s were converted to AC-119 gun-ships, & equipped with 7.62mm & 20mm rotary barrel guns. RCAF S/N 22114 is a C-119G built by Fairchild Aircraft at Hagerstown, MD & delivered to Royal Canadian Air Force Air Transport Command March 18, 1953. It served with various units including No. 436 Squadron at Downsview, & later Uplands, Ontario. It was flown to RCAF Storage Area, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan June 28, 1965; sold to a private United States firm February 1, 1967; then flown to the museum from Greybull, Wyoming October 24, 1988.
