Obituary of Owen Stickles Chino Hills, CA **Owen Dale Stickles**, 87, of Chino Hills, CA, formerly of Columbus, IN, died Monday, January 4, 2016 in California.

Born February 16, 1928 in Bedford, he was the son of George & Mary (Smale) Stickles. He married Ruth E. Luttrell on September 2, 1945 & she preceded him in death on April 11, 1992. He was a high school graduate. He started his military career in the U. S. Navy during World War II, he then served in the U. S. Airforce during the Korean War & the Vietnam War. After retiring, he volunteered at Hospice of South Central Indiana for 20 years.
